Many lots had been sold privately before the auction, including nine farms. Ketteringham Hall, formerly the residence of the Boileau family and now a private school, was withdrawn at £6,500. There are 28 acres of grounds. The auctioneers, R. C. Knight and Sons, of Norwich, announced that the village hall, previously let free to the hall committee, had now been presented by the vendors to the trustees for the use of the village."
